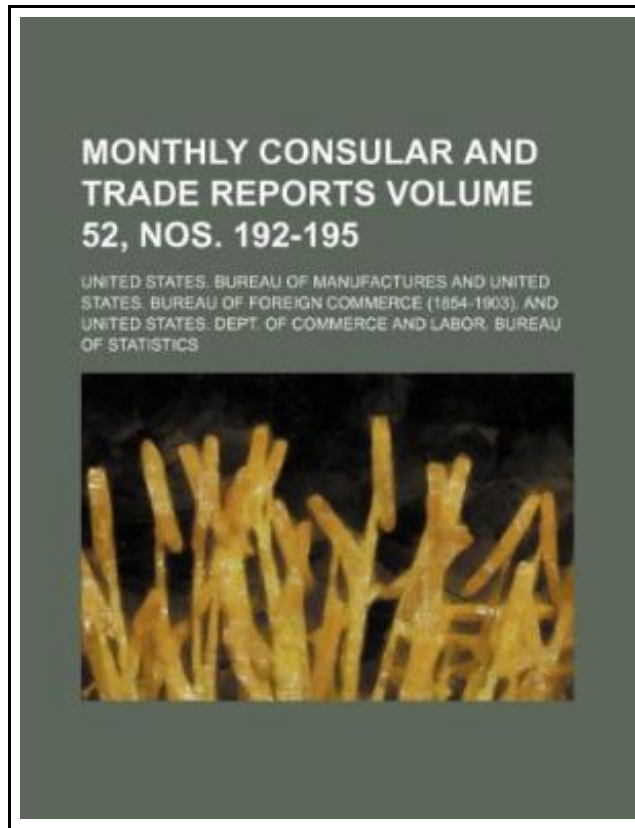

The private companies show the following general balance sheet in 1894: Receipts \$, 017, 213. 54 Operating expenses 3, 876, 787. 91 Net balance. 4, 140, 425. 63 Rolling stock, employees, and stations. --The State operated at the end of 1894, 2, 133 locomotives; the private companies, 551; total, 2, 684. The cars owned by the State numbered 50, 528; by the companies, 14, 854; total, 65, 382; of this total, 6, 303 cars were for passengers and 59, 079 for the freight traffic.
